Established in 1961, Southwestern College is the only public institution of higher education serving the southern portion of San Diego County. Located in the urban corridor between the City of San Diego and the international border with Mexico, Southwestern College serves approximately 20,000 students each semester. Offering more than 320 degrees and certificates, the college has also partnered with Point Loma Nazarene University to offer 4-year degrees on its Chula Vista campus. Specialty programs in allied health, international trade, child development and public safety are offered at its three Higher Education Centers, and a full aquatic program at the Crown Cove Aquatic Center.



% Prepared Students Over the Last 5 Years









Scorecard Completions in Years 7 & 8 (from 2008-09 cohort)





- Years 7 & 8 found only 86 additional Scorecard completions, of which 41 were transfers
- Completion would go up to 47% if we extended time to completion 2 more yrs (8 yrs instead of 6). Only a 3% increase.








The Completion Pathway, Unprepared




CTE Metrics: Career Skills Builder

CTE Metrics: Career Skills Builder by Gender


2013-14 Career Skills Builder: Median Earnings % Change (n, %) by Gender











2016 Peer Group Comparison: Completion, Overall





2016 Peer Group Comparison: 30-Units, Overall













2016 Peer Group Comparison: Remedial, ESL



2016 Peer Group Comparison: English Transfer Completion Year 1




2016 Peer Group Comparison: English Transfer Completion Year 2



2016 Peer Group Comparison: Math Transfer Completion Year 1






2016 Peer Group Comparison: Math Transfer Completion Year 2
