




Median Earnings for Full-Time, Year-Round Workers


Recent PPIC Study on Career Education

- Earnings vary across race / ethnicity




What are wages after career education?

Median Annual Earnings after Exit (2015-16)






Regional Growth (2018 – 2028)

Number of Jobs by Industry






Unique Online Job Postings

- Nearly 29,000 unique postings in 2017 and nearly 32,500 in 2018
- Top companies with online job postings in 2018 were:
 - Lfyt, Uber, United Technologies Corporation, Marriott International, Robert Half, Varsity Tutors LLC, CRST International, Inc., VIP Kidz LLC, Sharp Healthcare, UTC Aerospace Systems
- "Soft skills" are important to job posters in the South Region (2018)
 - Management (22%), Sales (20%), Customer Service (19%), Communications (15%)
- 8 of the top 10 certifications mentioned in online job postings in 2018 were related to healthcare (CNA, LVN, NP, Critical Care RN, CNOR Cert., etc.)
