








Career/Technical Enrollment








On-Line/Hybrid Enrollment








Day/Evening Course Enrollment















Percent of Students Who Earned at Least 30 Units



Persistence Rate






Percentage of cohort of first-time students with minimum of six units earned in their first fall term in the CCC who return and enroll in the subsequent fall term anywhere in the system
