ASSOCIATE IN ARTS DEGREE TRANSFER PREPARATION * (MAJOR CODE: 01281)

Prepares students to pursue careers in the film, television, and media production industry as cinematographers, editors, camera operators, sound designers, and screen writers in entertainment, public relations, education, government, and medical institutions

Students will learn needs analysis, proposal writing, script writing, marketing, graphics design, studio and field production, and video editing as applied to the production of media, such as instructional, documentary, broadcast journalism, and entertainment.
